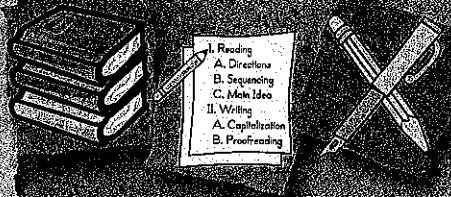

<p>Real is an adjective that means genuine or true. That was a real diamond.</p>	<p>Really is an adverb. Mary really played a good game.</p>
